

Dear Friends and Members of NEUMC:

One Sunday a few years ago I was gratified that someone picked up on a reference to "Fly Like an Eagle" by the Steve Miller Band when I said "time keeps on slipping ...into the future." Already, we are into the third month of 2017, and Lent is here, with Easter and an early spring is fast upon us. As the universe continues in its age-old cycles, we may feel our insignificance in comparison to the cosmos and its seemingly infinite life-span and and space expansion. Astrophysicists, however, have figured out that, yes, one day "time will surrender" (in the words of the gospel song writer), and this universe will be no more. In the face of being insignificant in cosmic terms, and not even a flash in the pan in chronological (time) terms, this would reasonably be grounds to have issues with self-esteem, and even an inferiority complex! In terms of the universe and pure briefness of existence, we are less than a speck of sand on the seashore, and as name-less as the uncountable stars that inhabit our galaxies. Yet, the ancient prophet recognizes the infinitude of the cosmos and still proclaims that "our God is an everlasting God," and the everlasting God knows the name of every star in the Milky Way, and knows the name of every man, woman, and child on Earth. This is truly awesome in the greatest sense of the word, that is, awe-inspiring. The kind of awe that is a little scary as well. When we have this scared but in awe feeling it is known as having the "fear of the Lord," such as, "the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." This is both comforting and a little nerve-wracking because we can't hide in our anonymity. Sometimes it's nice to be anonymous, to have no one notice you, and you can just go on your tidy little way with no responsibility and no accountability. It's kind of like sitting in the back of the church because then the pastor can't see you, ohhh, but he can see you. Not that I'm comparing the pastor to God, but you know what I mean. So, what do we do with this realization that though we are less than a speck in time and space yet we are precious in God's sight? First of all, it makes us realize how wondrous it is that Jesus came in the form of a man, that he wanted to take away our sin; it is a wonderment because he knows us. He knows us intimately, inside and out, and he still loves us. When we truly realize this, realize it and internalize it, then we feel, or should feel, deeply grateful; grateful and accountable. This Lenten season makes us realize how we fall short in following Jesus. We might consider in wonder how such simple commands are so difficult to carry out. Jesus used the most concise language with little explanation: "come, follow me, obey, pick up your cross, love one another, baptize, make disciples." Really, how hard can that be? It takes us a lifetime of faithfulness, the fellowship of the church, and the power of the Holy Spirit, to enable us to start to understand what it means to follow Jesus and to reach out with the good news that our God, the everlasting God, has a wondrous love, an amazing love, for his creation, for all of humanity, that found perfect expression in Jesus Christ. This Lenten season, and into Holy week, and culminating on Easter, let us consider how we may "love Jesus more dearly, follow him more nearly, day by day." Amen and Amen. Pastor Bert



Since ringing at the Christmas Cantata, we have been preparing for a complete return to active status as part of NEUMC's Music Ministry. In recent days, however, we have been hit by a series of health concerns that have required/will require some ringers to miss significant time.

If we were vocalists, we would shift some singers to cover the missing parts. A band would, typically, do the

opposite – moving those parts to other instruments. A bell choir is unique in that we are, in essence, 10 or more people playing one "instrument". ATTENTION ALL ARTISTS!! This means YOU, yes YOU!

The following comes from a little book entitled "A Million Little Ways" and helps us understand what the word "artist" means.

"...those who make art in the ways we traditionally think of art give the rest of us a framework from which to live our lives. They offer a gift of knowing what life could look like if it were handled more like a mysterious piece of art rather than a task-oriented list. We may not all have the same skill or training as do the painters or the musicians, but we all bear the image of a creative God."

"The first think we know about God is He made art. What is the first thing we know about you? We were made in the image of God."

"Ephesians 2:10-for we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago."

"God calls you his workmanship, his poiema. What happens when God writes poetry? We do. We happen. We are walking poetry, the kind that moves, the kind who has hands and feet, the kind with minds and will and emotion. We are what happens when God expresses himself."

"At the most basic level of our identity, your job and my job is to be a poem, the image bearers of God, made to reflect his glory. The art you and I were born to make is released out of the core of who we truly are, where our spirit is joined in union with the Spirit of God. Any movement coming from that place reflects the glory of God. This is our highest purpose and, ultimately, our greatest joy."

"Knowing you are a poem doesn't confine you to be artsy, it releases you to be you. We are art, every one of us. No matter personality, skill, talent, or inclinations. The essence of being human is that we were made by design with the hands of the Divine Artist."

Having said all that, we are inviting all artists in the church to come together on Tuesday, March 28th at 11 am in the Narthex to discuss and share how we might encourage and inspire one another to pursue "our highest purpose and ultimately our greatest joy." Please bring a bag lunch and any tools that you use to create your art — pencils, paper, paints, inks, scissors, glue, yarn, (yes knitting & crocheting is art!) or whatever you need, and we will create our "masterpieces" in fellowship with one another. 
