#### A Note from The Pastor...

"And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."

-Luke 2:7

Can you imagine? Pregnant and about to give birth...having traveled over eighty miles from Nazareth to Bethlehem at Caesar Augustus' decree...a week on the back of a donkey...and the labor pains begin. The time is drawing short and there is "no room for them in the inn." Things were too crowded. The world was distracted and had no idea that a child was about to be born who was the great "I AM". Dwight L. Moody writes, "And has the world grown better? Is not this world about like that little town in Bethlehem? There is no room for Him."

Every year, before Christmas, in the season of Advent, we hear the words of John the Baptist crying, "Repent! Messiah is coming! Repent." In the midst of elves and jolly men in red suits and white beards, lights and ornaments, presents and bows, we hear of a man wearing camel's hair and eating locust and wild honey, a man whose voice carried over the Jordan and has echoed through the hills for over two thousand years preparing us each year for the coming of the Christ. John the Baptist says, "Make Room."

John the Baptist is saying, "Go ahead and knock yourself doing all the things you normally do trying to get ready for Christmas. But you never will be ready unless you follow my instructions. I'm the Preparer of the Way. I know these things. Identify at least one road block that would keep the Christ from coming more fully into your life. Identify where your life has become cluttered, rooms of your heart filled. How will Christ find room? Through repentance, remove the obstacle, remove the dirt and grime. Clean house. Throw out the junk. Make room so Christ will find a place to lay His head. Only then will you be ready for Christmas!"

I remember Deb and I as we prepared for the birth of our firstborn, for his coming. We cleaned out the bedroom in our first home, a small three-bedroom rancher. To have an empty room we had to get rid of a lot of stuff. We then repainted the walls and in place of what was unnecessary clutter, made room for a nursery, for a crib and dresser, a changing table and Noah's Ark curtains. We had to "make room" for the baby that was to come, for Nate.



Five years later, Deb and I had to do the same thing to prepare for the coming of a second child. More clutter was gone through, more room had to be made, for Matthew.



So much work to prepare for the arrival of our children, the clutter thrown out, room created for another to live and love and grow. If we are willing to put in so much work to get rid of things and make room for a child, a parent, a friend, shouldn't we be willing to do the same, willing to put in even more work, for the One who stands and knocks at the door of our hearts, the One who is ready to enter each room and fill our homes to overflowing.

In Revelation 3:20, Jesus says, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me."

"O Holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us we pray; Cast out our sin, and enter in, be born in us today..."

Have we made room for Christ this Christmas?

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

Invite Him in. Bow before the manger. Make room in your heart and you too, like the shepherds of old, will find yourself "glorifying and praising God for all the things" you have "heard and seen."

#### **About The Itzels**

A lot of Christian bands and singers have come and gone over the past 30 years, but the Itzels have stood the test of time. Bill and Karen, along with their children, Jessica, Ryan, Shannon, and Siri have now been touring full-time for over 3 decades, and even after 57 recordings, 365 original songs, and over 3500 concerts, they are more focused than ever.

The Itzels have designed their ministry to supplement the work of the local church. An Itzels' concert includes original music, modern and traditional hymns and worship songs, an emphasis on family relationships, and teaching of the Word.

There are many accolades that the Itzels could focus on such as Bill's number-one songs, "Saved To The Uttermost" and "He's Still In The Fire" with the Speer Family, appearances on the Bill Gaither videos, 2 Grammy and 2 Dove award nominations, and headlining concerts for over 40,000 people, but to the Itzels, there is no greater thrill than hearing the voices of God's people lifting musical praise to their sovereign Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

In 1999 Bill and Karen officially sat down and totally re-worked the vision for their ministry. With a philosophy that was focused on how the local church operates and ministers, they were ready to become a one-of-a-kind ministry that churches could count on to fill "pulpit-time" in the 21st century.

In 2012 Bill and Karen formed the non-profit ministry "Bill and Karen Itzel Ministries Inc." for the specific purpose of spreading the gospel through biblically based songs and mission outreaches. In 2021, they added a weekly street preaching ministry to their concert ministry.

While the Itzels have no real answer as to what style they consider themselves (contemporary, country, rock, gospel, traditional), they have always been balanced and blended musically, with the emphasis on the lyrics and message of the songs.

The Itzels are singers/songwriters who are committed to Christ, committed to truth, and committed to excellence.



After praying with her, I was able to share some things that I had learned while dealing with my own autoimmune disorder.

As we were saying goodbye, I shared that I felt that God had brought me there that day to pray with her. She heartily agreed that she believed that too.

I believe that the Holy Spirit nudged me to go to Fair Hill so that he could use me to provide comfort to an anxious mom. I am so glad that I felt the Spirit and followed through. What an honor to be used by our caring, awesome God!



#### Synopsis


